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What are opiates?

- Any drug that is derived from opium...usually used in the treatment of pain
 - Morphine
 - Vicodine
 - Demerol
 - Lorcet
 - Naloxone
 - Oxycontin
 - Methadone
 - Hydrocodone
 - Suboxone
 - Heroin



Intoxication effects



- Drowsiness
- Euphoria
- Nausea
- Mental confusion
- Paranoia
- Slowed respiratory functions
- Depressed heart rate



Long term effects

- Stomach issues- constipations, tears in the bowels, ulcers
- Increase risk of pneumonia due to suppression of breathing
- Liver damage
- Paranoia
- Kidney failure
- Muscle deterioration
- Collapse veins
- Increased sensitivity to pain
- Breakdown of the immune system



Long term effects

- Infected lining of the heart-heart disease
- Aggressive/Irritable
- Mood swings
- Lack of interest in daily activities
- Anxiety
- Dental issues
- Tolerance/Addiction/Dependence
- Withdrawal
- Death
